IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR NEW CSD GRADUATE STUDENTS

Congratulations on your decision to join our Speech Language Pathology or Audiology program at the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders. We put together this packet of general information to help you prepare for your arrival at Syracuse.

IMMEDIATE ACTION ITEMS:

1. Go to CSD.SYR.EDU and find the "Graduate Student Checklist" on the Admitted Students Menu. The checklist refers to necessary steps and required departmental forms to complete.
2. If you are a US citizen, you must file the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** as soon as possible. <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/#>

PREPARATION FOR ARRIVAL:

1. Syracuse University must have a **degree-bearing transcript** from your undergraduate and/or graduate institution when you matriculate. CSDCAS will not send us your transcript that you sent for your application. If you are still engaged in study, please wait until your degree is officially posted to order the transcript. 2. [Activate your NetID](#) for access to [MySlice](#) and SUEmail account. This can be done after you are matriculated in the program (after deposit is paid).
3. Be aware that the Audiology and Speech Language Pathology programs at Syracuse University are now using a secure, online program to track clinical experiences, hours, and course competencies called the **TYPHON ALLIED HEALTH STUDENT TRACKING (AHST)** system. This tracking is essential for documentation of requirements for ASHA certification and program requirements, and allows both you and the program to easily monitor and your progress. In addition, this system enables students to maintain an electronic portfolio and manage a variety of external documents. During orientation in August, you will receive training in how to use the Typhon software. There will be a **one-time \$80 fee** that is required to be paid by the student directly to Typhon by credit card, which will allow you access to this system over the entire course of your graduate studies and then *continuing for three years after graduation*. This fee will not be due until after you are trained in August, at the time you log in to the system the first time.

TUITION:

The 2017-2018 rate for graduate tuition is \$1,500.00 per credit.

HOUSING:

On-Campus Housing Options

Some on-campus housing for graduate students at Syracuse University is available through privately-managed all-inclusive campus housing facilities. These include [University Village Apartments](#), which are in the Skytop apartment area, as well as [Park Point](#) and [Campus West](#) facilities on/near the main campus.

Off-Campus Housing

Private off-campus housing is available in the residential neighborhoods surrounding the campus, and beyond. HEALTH MATTERS:

Immunizations and Health Records

This form must be completed and returned **before June 15th**. Students born after January 1, 1957 must submit documentation of the following immunizations administered after 12 months of age:

2 doses of measles vaccine;

1 dose of mumps vaccine; and

1 dose of rubella vaccine.

Other medical records may also be required. Go to the above link for complete information.

There is a mandatory Health Services Fee for all full-time, matriculated graduate students. This will be billed in the fall and spring semesters only. Payment of the fee entitles students to health services in the clinics of Syracuse

University Health Center. The cost of support services such as x-rays, selected procedures, medications, and hospital supplies are in addition to the health fee, although often at a reduced cost to students. Part-time students may opt to pay the health fee for the same coverage, or pay per office visit. Graduate students who hold assistantships, fellowships or tuition scholarships of at least 12 credits per semester receive a health fee remission.

Insurance

All full-time new students, new and returning international students, and graduate Fellows are required to have health insurance that provides adequate coverage while studying in Syracuse. New students entering Syracuse University will be able to submit proof of coverage on the [Gallagher Student Health website](#). Students unable to provide proof of adequate coverage will be charged for and enrolled in the University-sponsored health insurance plan. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS:

International students are only admitted to Syracuse University by authority of the Graduate School upon recommendation by each department. The CSD admission letter is contingent on the The Graduate School will alert all International applicants of their admission (and perhaps the conditions that must be met by the applicant in order to comply with University and/or US Federal policies). Once an official offer of admission is made by the Graduate School (without conditions), the Office of International Services will process and send all necessary documents for obtaining a student visa. PARKING:

Student Permits

It is highly recommended that you purchase a parking permit. The best permit option for the lowest price is for the Skytop lot right next to our building. Students must park in the overflow lot, but it is still quite close.
